Bob Swartz passed away on May 23, 2015 after a lengthy illness. Bob had been a Fame Cities member for some time but his illness often prevented his attendance at meetings. He was an armor modeler of some note and at one time had a side business providing aftermarket track links and other armor accessories.

Fame Cities IPMS extends our deepest sympathies to the families of both these men. They contributed to our chapter and will be missed.

Fame Cities Modeler of the Year Rules

Revised May 2015

One award only – 1st Place award, \$50.00 gift certificate, or cash equivalent, and award plaque

RULES

Modeler of the Year competition runs for 12 months beginning on August 1st, ending on July 31st of the next year. The Modeler of the Year will be awarded at the Fame Cities picnic in September. Points are awarded for competition at ANY Fame Cities monthly meeting contest, whether in Theme or Non-Theme category. Points will also be awarded at IPMS-style contests anywhere, including Invitationals, Regionals, or Nationals. Points will NOT be awarded for contests that do not meet IPMS category criteria, such as AMPS or NNL, which specify categories ONLY for certain criteria, AMPS being Armor only, NNL being Car classes only. Small contests with limited categories will also not be considered.

POINTS AWARDED

Bringing a model at the monthly meeting	1 point*

Entering the monthly Theme contest	3 points*
Winning the monthly Theme or Non-Theme contest	1st-3pts, 2d-2pts, 3d-1 pt
Entering an IPMS rules Invitational	3 points*
Win at Invitational	1st-3 pts, 2d-2pts, 3d-1pt
Entering an IPMS rules Regional contest	5 points*
Win at Regional	1st-5pts, 2d-4pts, 3rd-3pts
Entering National IPMS Contest	1 point
Win at Nationals	1st-10pts, 2d-6pts, 3rd-3pts
ADDITIONAL POINTS AWARDED	
Doing a club demonstration or activity such as "Make & Take"	5pts
Judging at any non-Club contest	5pts
Sponsoring a monthly Theme contest on any subject	5pts

Points totals will be tabulated monthly and updated listings will be posted at the meeting or on the web site.

"Total" means you get X number of points no matter how many models you enter, i.e. you bring one model you get 1 point, bring ten models you get 1 point.

**

Any contest other than an IPMS Regional or National, is an Invitational

Fame Cities Monthly "Non-Theme winners can be entered in a later "Theme" contest and receive points toward the MOY from both entries. Winners at Invitational, Regional, National contests can be entered in the monthly contest the meeting IMMEDIATELY following that contest; i.e. you win at BlizCon in February, you can still enter the monthly at the February meeting.
